



# ARIZONA WEEKLY GAS PRICE UPDATE (WEEK OF AUGUST 3RD)

Arizona gas prices have fallen 0.3 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$2.30/g today, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 2,269 stations. Gas prices in Arizona are 0.8 cents per gallon lower than a month ago and stand 53.7 cents per gallon lower than a year ago.

According to GasBuddy price reports, the cheapest station in Arizona is priced at \$1.71/g today while the most expensive is \$3.49/g, a difference of \$1.78/g. The lowest price in the state today is \$1.71/g while the highest is \$3.49/g, a difference of \$1.78/g.

The national average price of gasoline is unchanged in the last week, averaging \$2.17/g today. The national average is unchanged from a month ago and stands 53.0 cents per gallon lower than a year ago.

Neighboring areas and their current gas prices:

Las Vegas- \$2.66/g, unchanged from last week's \$2.65/g.  
Phoenix- \$2.40/g, down 0.6 cents per gallon from last week's \$2.41/g.  
Tucson- \$2.14/g, down 1 cent per gallon from last week's \$2.15/g.

"Impressively and for a fifth straight week, average gas prices have remained quiet, with prices fluctuating less than a few cents per gallon over the last month. While it's been a bit of a bore, it's certainly still to motorists advantage as prices remain at their lowest seasonally in well over a decade," said Patrick De Haan, head of petroleum analysis for GasBuddy. "Gasoline demand looks to be trending

higher, but just barely, which could eventually end the stable gas prices. For now, heading into the last few weeks of summer, I don't think we'll see the national average eclipse \$2.25 per gallon, so if you're making plans for Labor Day, that will mean just about everyone is in the \$2 per gallon range, with the exception of California and Hawaii. It won't be a bad time if you're choosing to hit the road, as over a dozen states still have average gas prices under \$2 per gallon."
