The Badgers got a huge first half performance from Jason Parent, that helped beat the Mohave Thunderbirds 72-41 in the Badger Dome. Parent scored 18 points, 16 in the first half, with two of those baskets dunks, as the home team raced out to a quick lead.

Coach Travis Stedman, "We came out strong, but as they game continued, I thought we could have played better defense tonight. We will have to do better, but a wins a win."
