



APPLE WATCH TATTLES ON MAN - CAUSES HIS ARREST: ALEXA FEELS VINDICATED - YCSO

On December 1st, at approximately 1:15 am, an Apple Smart Watch initiated a call to Yavapai County Sheriff's Office 911 alerting them to a crash that occurred at the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) yard in Cordes Lakes.
