MARY BETH HRIN DECLARES CANDIDACY FOR YAVAPAI COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISOR DISTRICT ONE

Yavapai County Conservative Consultant Seeks Opportunity to Serve Yavapai County Citizens in Arizona

Prescott, October 15, 2015 – Yavapai County Republican Mary Beth Hrin today announced her candidacy for County Board of Supervisor in District 1, a district which includes the towns of Bagdad, Congress, Prescott, Skull Valley, Wilhoit, Yarnell and sections of Wickenburg and Peoria.

Ms. Hrin said, “Since I arrived in Yavapai County in 2002, I have established strong ties across District 1 and Yavapai County. I have worked on behalf of numerous conservative causes as an activity coordinator, volunteer and liaison. I have the education, experience and preparation needed to defend our values and principles in Yavapai County. From day one, I can hit the ground running and be effective for Yavapai County families in the district.”

A lifelong Republican with a proven record of fighting for conservative principles, Ms. Hrin has worked as a principle researcher, writer and editor on such projects as the Williamson Valley Corridor (general) Plan. Ms. Hrin is a graduate of Temple University with both a law degree and a L.L.M. in tax law. An appellate attorney, she has worked as an Assistant District Attorney for the City of Philadelphia. “One of the most pressing issues facing Yavapai County is the exploding cost of the public safety pensions and its impact on the taxpayers.” Ms. Hrin believes her experience as an attorney gives her the ability to remain objective, ask critical questions and propose solutions to ensure the hardworking taxpayers continue to receive the services they finance and deserve.

Having most recently served as a campaign adviser to Prescott mayor-elect Harry Oberg, Ms. Hrin observed a glaring inefficiency in the lack of regional cooperation among the various municipalities and the county. “Some will maintain that Yavapai County has cut spending to the bone but I respectfully disagree. I believe Yavapai County taxpayers are still paying for excessive waste and unfair tax shifts due to our leaders' continued inability to make the hard decisions. With the budget crises we all face, now is the time for inter-governmental agreements to provide services and attract businesses to the county.”
